Recipes





Ingredients:

200g milk chocolate, chopped
20g butter, chopped
100g pkt Chang's Original Fried Noodles
1/2 cup (40g) shredded coconut, toasted
60 M&M's Speckled Eggs

Method:

Line a baking tray with baking paper.

Place the chocolate and butter in a heatproof bowl over a saucepan of simmering water. Stir with a metal spoon for 5 mins or until chocolate melts and mixture is smooth.

Remove from heat. Add the fried noodles and coconut and stir to combine.

Use 2 dessert spoons to arrange the chocolate mixture into small mounds on the prepared tray.

Create a small hollow in the centre of each mound and place 3 eggs in each hollow.

Place in the fridge for 30 mins or until set.





Ingredients:

1 cup almond butter	3/4 cup Greek yogurt
1/4 cup honey	3/4 cup strawberries
2 tsp vanilla extract	3/4 cup blueberries
1/4 teaspoon salt	1 medium banana
2 cup oats, dry	3/4 cup grapes, green

Method:

In a microwave safe bowl, add almond butter, honey, vanilla and salt. Microwave for 20 seconds, then stir until smooth.

Take 1 cup of the oats and place in a blender. Blend until the oats are finely chopped and resembles flour. Set aside.

Add the other cup of oats to the almond butter mixture and stir. Slowly add in a little of your homemade oat flour at a time until you get a mixture that you can form into a crust. Depending on your brand almond butter the amount of flour may vary.

Take small amounts of the mixture and form Easter egg shaped disks. Place onto parchment paper or foil for easy cleanup.

Once all the Easter eggs are formed, spread on a layer of greek yogurt. Top with sliced fruit to make your designs and enjoy!





Ingredients:

2 cups self-raising flour
2 cups milk
2 eggs

One banana
2 blueberries
1/2 strawberry
1 cheese single

Method:

Heat a pan with cooking spray and while you're waiting, stir all the pancake ingredients until mixture is smooth.

For each bunny face, you'll make three pancakes – one large around 5 inches, and two small around 1 1/2 inches in diameter. You might want to consider a pancake dispenser if you like perfection! Cook pancakes until the edges are dry. Flip and cook until golden. Remove from the pan and organise on a plate.

Peel a banana and slice about 1 inch off one end. Cut the long portion into two ears. Cut three pieces from the remaining inch. Two of the circles will be eyes. Cut the other circle in half and create the teeth. Cut a strawberry and add the nose. Add the blueberries on the eyes.

Cut the cheese single into strips and make the whiskers. Serve!



If you have extra pancakes leftover you can also make Easter Bunny butts!

Crafts





Materials:

- glitter craft foam
- clothespin
- yellow paper or card stock
- small scrap of foam/ cardboard
- tape
- black and orange gel pens
- scissors

Method:

Start by cutting out a small rectangle of glitter foam, about 1.5" wide by 2" tall, then trim around the corners to turn it into an oval egg shape. Then cut a zig zag shape across the egg.

Pinch open the clothespin. While it's open, add a small strip of crafter's tape to 3/4" of the side, front edge of the top and bottom where the egg is going to go.

Lay the egg upside down on the table, making sure the top and bottom egg pieces are lined up and together.

Carefully press the clothes pin onto the back of the foam egg so that the opening in the clothespin lines up with the opening in the cracked egg. Try to line it up so that the end of the clothespin where your chick is going to go is in the middle of the egg.

Cut out a tiny chick shape from yellow paper or cardstock, about 1/2" wide by 3/4" tall. Then, use a black gel pen and an orange gel pen to draw the eyes and beak onto the little paper chick shape.

Take a tiny piece of craft foam (or cardboard, or anything else with a little bit of thickness to it) and using crafter's tape to attach it to the back of the clothespin where the chick is going to go. Then add a little bit of crafter's tape to the paper chick and attach it to the little foam spacer you just attached.

When you flip it over to the front, you should be able to see the top of the chick's head and the entire face when the clothespin is open. If it's not in the right position, just peel off the chick and adjust it.





Materials:

Coloured construction paper
Scissors
Glue stick
Plain or coloured paper
Paint and paintbrushes/crayons/coloured pens/pencils
Washi tape (optional)

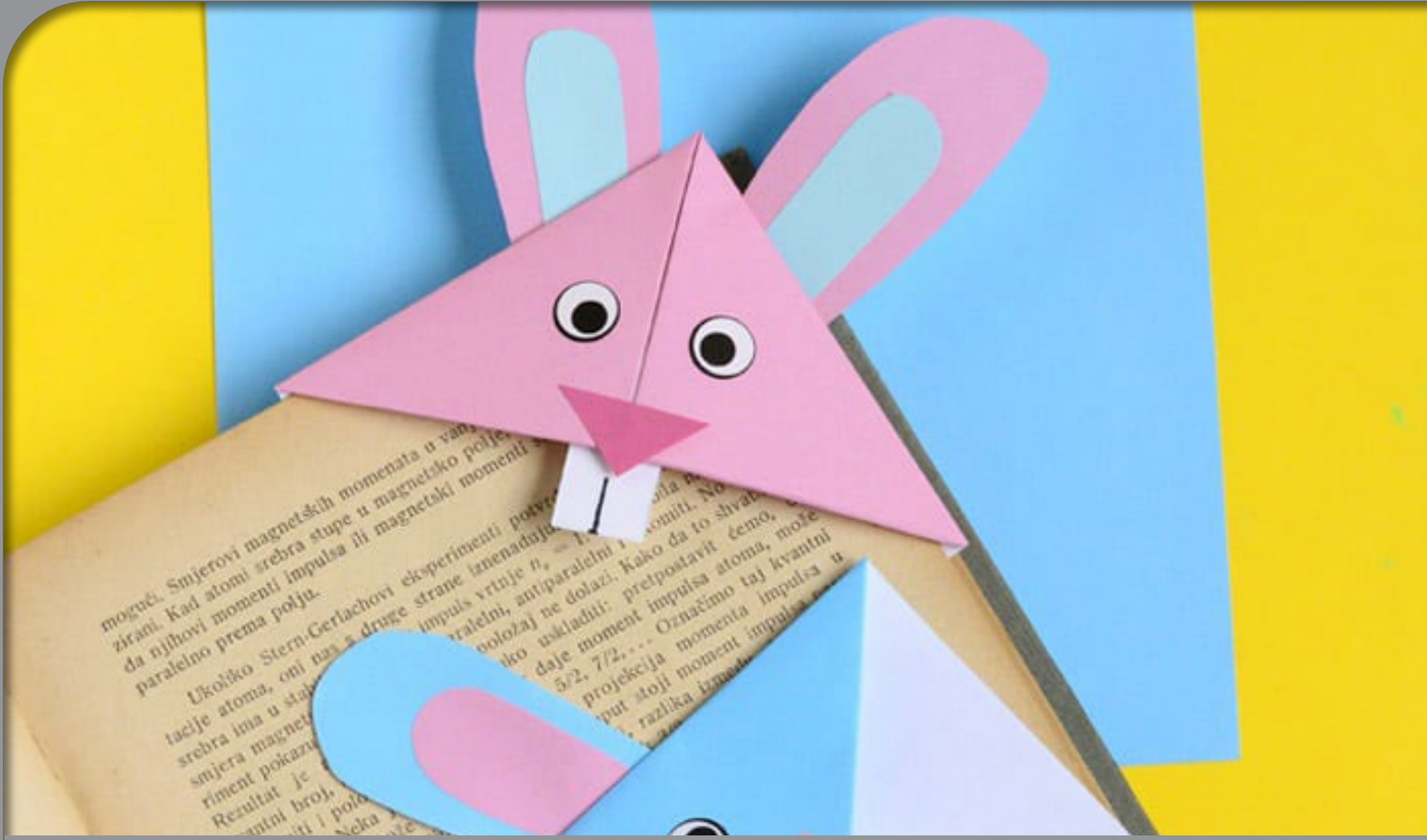
Instructions:

Step 1. Fold a heavy piece of construction paper in half like a card and then print [this template](#) to cut out an egg shape from one side of the card.

Step 2. Create your artwork on plain or coloured paper using paint, crayons, pens, pencils, washi tape or whatever you like.

Step 3. Once you're happy with your artwork, glue around the egg shape in the inside of the card and press your artwork down to reveal a beautiful egg pattern.





Materials:

origami paper
googly eye stickers
white paper

black marker
scissors
glue

Instructions:

Fold the paper diagonally. Unfold.

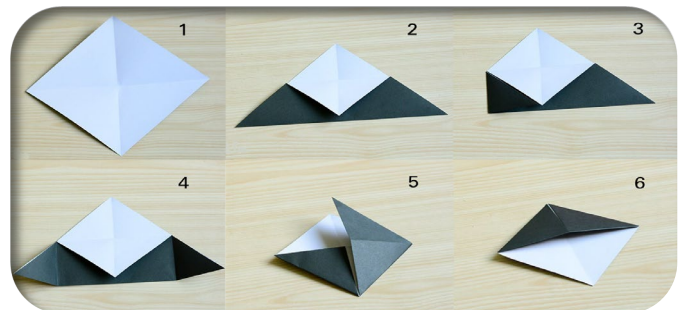
Fold into a triangle (coloured side on the outside). Grab hold of the top of the triangle (one sheet only) and fold it toward the bottom of the triangle.

Fold the left and right corner towards the bottom centre of the triangle. Crease and unfold.

Again grab the corner, this time folding it towards the top of the triangle. Crease well. Do the same with the other side.

Now tuck both tops inside the pocket. You now have your corner bookmark! You can also tuck the white triangle inside the pocket.

Cut ears, teeth and nose and glue them on, and add two eye stickers (or just draw your own).





Materials:

Hardboiled eggs
White vinegar
Shaving cream

Gel food colour
Muffin pan
toothpicks

Instructions:

Place your eggs into a shallow container of vinegar to prepare them to take the dye. Keep the eggs in the vinegar for at least 20 minutes, but keep in mind that the longer the eggs steep, the more brittle the shell will become. Don't leave them any longer than four hours. Carefully rinse the vinegar off the eggs and pat dry.

In a muffin tin, fill each cavity approximately 2/3 full with shaving cream.

This is a messy craft. Be sure to protect your work surface and wear gloves. Add a healthy drop of gel food colouring in two or three complementary colours on top of the shaving cream in each cavity. Take care when making colour selections—orange and blue are pretty together, but when mixed they make brown.

Use a toothpick or a wooden skewer to gently stir the food colouring into the cream, adding another drop of colour if needed. A gentle swirl of your skewer will give you a marbled effect on your finished eggs, and a more vigorously combined mixture will give you more colour on the eggs with less white areas and less definition between colours. Both techniques make pretty eggs, so feel free to experiment to find the results you're happiest with.

Gently place your dry egg on top of the coloured shaving cream in your muffin tin, trying not to allow the egg to touch the bottom of the tin. Carefully fold over the shaving cream on top of the egg to completely cover it. Allow the eggs to sit in the mixture 10 minutes for more pastel colours and overnight for bolder colours.

Once the colour has set, rinse your eggs directly under the tap. Gently pat your eggs dry with a paper towel and place on a smooth surface.





Materials:

potatoes
knife
assorted craft paints

plate
towel
craft paper to stamp on

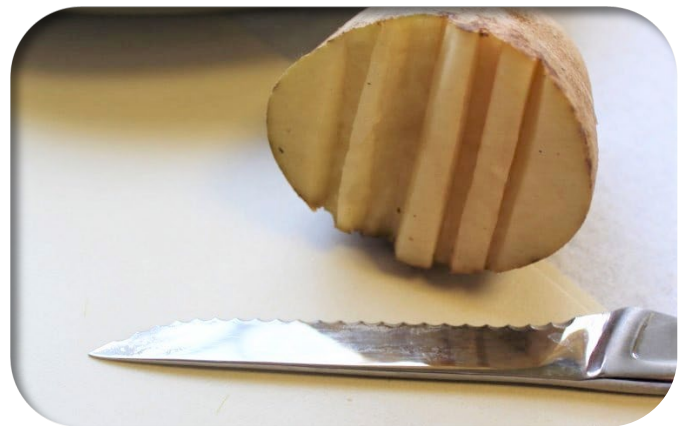
Directions:

Step 1. Begin by cutting the potato in half. Press the open end of the potato onto the towel to help absorb the moisture. You will find that the insides are quite wet and can make the next step slippery and dangerous if you don't dry them.

Step 2. Once the open end of your potato is dry, you can begin cutting your designs into it. Use a knife or pick to make lines, circles, zig zags, and other shapes. Be careful as the potato can be slippery. Use a careful hand and take your time.

Step 3. Press the open end of the potato to the towel to dry it again, as cutting into it can create additional moisture. You are now ready for stamping.

Step 4. Press the cut end of the potato into the paint. It is easiest to put the paint on a plate for easy dipping. Remove any excess paint before stamping. (Or, you can use a brush for more detailed painting.) Then, press the potato stamps to the paper and press firmly. Pull away and see your egg design on the paper. Repeat as much as you want. When you want to use a new colour, just rinse the potato under water and it will rinse clean. There is no need to cut a new potato.

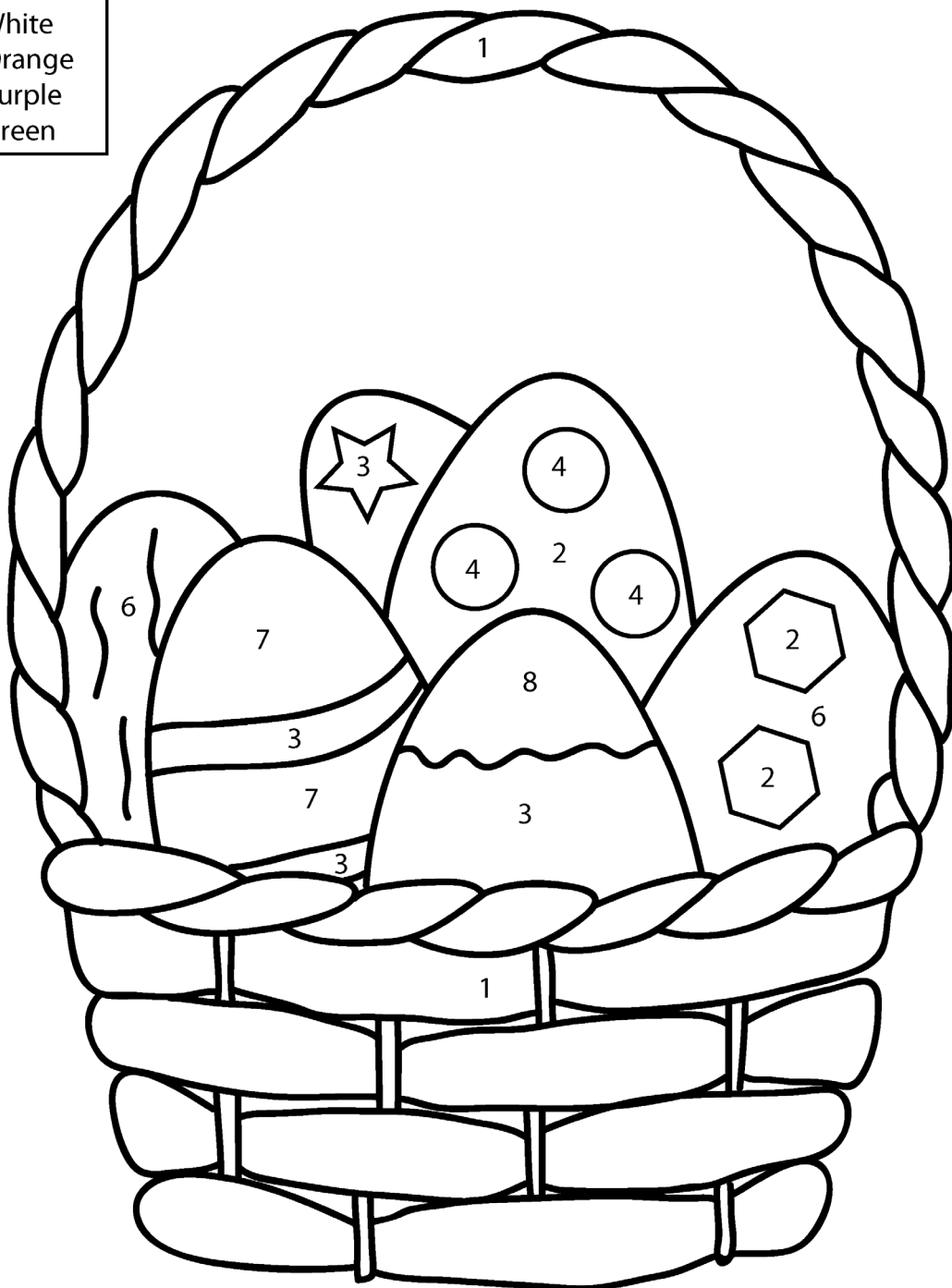

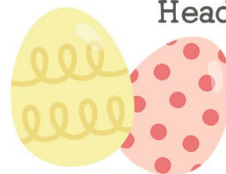

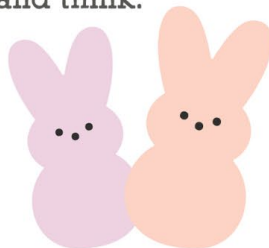
